Wellesley Park Explorers

Welcome back to all of our children and hello and welcome to all of our 'new' families that have recently joined at Wellesley Park Explorers. We can see that the children have settled really well into pre-school as it can be a tricky time for some children, but they have all done an amazing job and are enjoying our pre-school routines.

This term we are learning 'all about me'. The children have had their picture taken and had the chance to get messy and talk about colours before making some beautiful handprints. We then asked the children 'who lives in your house?' or 'what is your favourite colour?' We then used this artwork to form one of our displays in the classroom.

We are also concentrating on the children making relationships, developing pretend play, having conversations, jumping from topic to topic and develop large and small motor skills, so they can manage buttons and zips.

We have also spoken about things that are happening within our community and we hear that many of the children might be going to the carnival this weekend. We look forward to hearing all about this next week!





Reception

The Reception children have settled in beautifully and have quickly learnt the routines and expectations in class. They have started phonics lessons and already know nearly a dozen sounds! We have been doing lots of blending of words orally and also using letter /grapheme cards to build simple words like: sat, pin, dog.

Our Talk 4 Writing book this term is 'The Little Red Hen' and the children are loving learning how to retell the story using words and actions, following a story map.







We are doing daily work on writing first names correctly and thinking about how to hold our pencils with a nice pincer grip. The children are already learning to love reading and the book nook is a popular area in the classroom. The children often choose to sit there and look at picture books together!

It is wonderful to see the children interacting and communicating really nicely with each other and forming new friendships across the class. Playtimes have been lots of fun as the children love using the trim trail and climbing on the climbing frame! It has been a great start to this first new term for our youngest pupils!

Year 1

We have had a jam packed first few weeks of Year One! The children have settled in well to the new routines and expectations and are working very hard. I am super proud of them!

In English we have learnt our story of "The Three Little Pigs" using a story map and actions to help embed the text. The children then worked in groups and performed the story in front of the class which was lovely to watch. They have also learnt what a noun is as well as an adjective and have come up with some fantastic examples to describe a variety of nouns. The children have begun to innovate the story and make it their own, using their own noun and adjective ideas for the characters. It's been lovely to see their stories come to life in their writing.

In Maths, we have been looking at place value with numbers to 10. Within this topic, the children have learnt how to compare groups, write digits as words, use the language of fewer, more and the same as well as find one more or less than a given number!

In Science, we began our material topic by looking at raw materials to gain an understanding of the different materials we have around us. We then looked at objects that are made from various materials and worked hard to distinguish between the object and the material. Next, we are going to look at the properties of these materials so we can work towards in investigation which may involve The Three Little Pigs...

In History, we have begun to develop an understanding of the past and present so we could look at the shops in Wellington high street and see how much these have changed within living memory,

looking back as far as when our grandparents may have been little. Dave Farrow and Colin Spackman from Wellington Town Council visited us to share lots of primary sources to help us develop our understanding of how much the high street has changed over the years!

We are excited to see where the rest of this half term takes us and to see how much more learning we can squeeze in before a well deserved break for us all!







Year 2

The Year 2 children have made a positive start to the school year. Mrs Lewis would like to thank the parents for making her feel welcome and bearing with her whilst she gets to know your faces at pick up!

The children have been working hard to build up their stamina for witing and they have enjoyed imitating and innovating the Jack and the Beanstalk story, focussing on setting descriptions. They have extended their vocabulary with words such as eerie, towering and majestic.

They children have improved their English skills and now can input, a range of adjectives, prepositions and time markers to bring the setting alive.

In Art, the children have been fortunate to have Mrs G teach them. They have painted some beautiful Claude Monet inspired water lilies which you will be able to see in all their glory when you come in for our class exhibition later in the term (date TBC).

In Music, we have been singing South African inspired songs and, in computing, we have had the glockenspiels out, making patterns. We are set to compose our own music soon using the computers!



Year 3/4

Wow! What an amazing start to Year 3/4 we have had. The children have been fantastic and settled into their new classes incredibly well. They should be proud of all of the work they have done so far. We are very much looking forward to the rest of the year!


In Maths, we have been learning about place value. The children have been working really hard with numbers up to 1,000 and have shown a lot of resilience in rounding big numbers to the nearest 10,100 and 1,000.

Over the last few weeks in English, we have been focusing on a defeat the monster tale called 'The cobbler of Krakow'. The children have produced some lovely short burst writing using some of the tools we have explored, such as, expanded noun phrases and similes. We are looking forward to writing our own defeat the monster tales in the next couple of weeks.

In Guided Reading we have been reading The Twits by Roald Dahl. The children have enjoyed predicting what will happen next and learning some great new vocabulary.


In Science, we have began learning about teeth and the digestive system, the children have shown lots of enthusiasm. We thoroughly enjoyed our science enquiry, in which we were exploring the effects of different liquids on teeth enamel by testing them on eggshells and observing the changes over 4 days.


In History, we have been learning about Ancient Greece and the children have enjoyed learning about what life was like for boys and girls in the different city-states and are looking forward to learning more in the next few weeks.











Year 5

We have had a fantastic start to Year 5 with lots of exciting learning happening in both classes.

The children have started their weekly swimming lessons at Wellington Pool. We have been so impressed by the resilience and determination the children have shown and have been blown away by their willingness to have a go, even when feeling a little apprehensive.

In English, we are coming to the end of our first unit, a quest story called Perseus and Medusa. The children have designed their own monsters and we have had some fantastic lessons focusing on descriptive vocabulary to really hook our readers.



In History, the children have been gripped with our WW1 topic and have absorbed all of the information we have taught them. They are very inquisitive and have had us answering some tricky questions! Thank goodness for Google! We have learnt about life in the trenches, how the war started and have emersed ourselves in a 'day in the life4' of a WW1 soldier.

We were all incredibly lucky to have a visit from bronze medal Olympian, Becky Wilde last week. She was a huge inspiration to us all and the children asked her some fantastic questions.

Overall the children have had a great half term, they have worked hard and produced some wonderful work! Well-done Year 5.







Year 6

Our Year 6 children have had a wonderful start to the year - we are all excited about the year ahead and have many wonderful activities planned. The children have shown tremendous resilience and determination towards their initial assessments; we are really impressed by their overall attitude to learning. We thoroughly enjoyed the visit from the Rowing Olympian Becky Wilde.

In Maths, we have been developing an in depth understanding of Place Value and will be moving onto the Four Operations next week. In English, we are identifying and using a range of features within suspense writing; the children have enjoyed using figurative language, personification and pathetic fallacy to enhance their work and build tension for the reader. We have moved onto the innovate stage of our Hansel and Gretal text this week. We have started reading 'Rooftoppers' by Katherine Rundell as part of Guided Reading, the children are making fantastic predictions and inferences about the characters. We have been able to understand a range of new vocabulary and investigate a wide range of collective nouns - see if your children can remember any of these.

In Science, we are investigating the fascinating heart and circulatory system. The children were particularly interested by the chambers and the four main components of blood including their role within the body.



Our Victorian History work has involved understanding the Industrial Revolution and what life was like for those living in rural and urban areas. Faye from Jemison class kindly brought in some wonderful artifacts to share.

In PSHE, the children were working collaboratively to build bridges and understanding the importance of listening to each other when solving problems.

Finally, the children have created some amazing artwork based on Picasso for our Year 6 display boards.
