What is the rule of law?

The rule of law is the importance of following the rules set by law, in order for us to be safe and happy. It means understanding what is right and wrong, and the consequences for when rules are broken.

accountability	Taking responsibility for your own actions
consequence	the effect, result, or outcome of something occurring earlier
law	Rules, set by government, that have to be followed

At Wellesley Park, we are taught the importance of following the rules from an early age, and the Golden Rules are displayed and reinforced in every classroom. The behaviour ladder is used to hold us accountable for our behaviour and we understand and receive consequences for this if appropriate.
